Fred Colburn Turns 100 Years Old









Intercontinental Ballistic Missiles

In the 60's, member Walter Jones lived with Intercontinental Ballistic Missiles. Walter told of his experiences in California and Kansas at the March meeting of the Shade-Lodi History and Genealogy Association. He showed slides explaining the missiles, their liquid oxygen and jet fuels, and how they were maintained. He described the sites. including powerhouse and control center, where the missile silos were kept ready for launch if ever needed. The ICBMs were a deterrent force and fortunately never were fired. The warheads on the Titan II missiles were twenty times as powerful as the atomic bomb that was dropped on Hiroshima.

The site was a large complex of tunnels, where Walter lived under ground. He mostly walked and climbed to get around and was on six hours, then off six hours. The tunnels were deep, as the missiles were over one hundred feet tall. It was difficult to go outside in the sunlight after so long with only mercury vapor lighting. Once he had to be evacuated after getting ptomaine poisoning from bad spaghetti sauce. All in all it was a fascinating presentation.

Using DNA to Help Search Your Family Tree

Dr. Rose M. Isgrigg presented the program at the April meeting of the Shade-Lodi History and Genealogy Association. She related DNA and genes to inherited traits and explained how in humans mitochondrial DNA is inherited solely from the mother, that is matrilineal inheritance. This is analogous to the patrilineal inheritance where Y chromosomes of males are inherited solely from the father.

She compared the kinds of information that are obtained by DNA tests from Ancestry, 23andMe, and MyHeritage. She showed how one can learn about people related to you, even distant cousins, after having your DNA tested. Other information that can be learned is the percentages of your ethnic ancestry, as well as possible inherited disorders.



SCCA February 8, 2017 Meeting Minutes (APPROVED 3-8-17)

(25 present, 17 members+ 8 officers/board)

The regular monthly meeting of the Shade Community Center Association was held on Wednesday, February 8th at 7:01 pm in the Shade Community Center cafeteria, President Jerry Foster being in the chair and Recording Secretary Gail Jordan being present. Fran Moxley installed Alex Couladis as Treasurer for 2017.

Minutes of the January 11th regular monthly meeting were distributed by Gail Jordan for reading. Tammy Foster moved for approval as written; minutes approved. Gail also distributed minutes of the January 24th and February 1st Executive Board meetings; Fran Moxley moved for approval as written; minutes approved.

Alex Couladis distributed the Treasurer's Report for January. Net income was -\$3859.58 including \$840.87 for the newsletter mailing to all residents of the township. Checking account balance was \$17,583.96. Report was filed for financial review.

Fran Moxley distributed calendars for February and March. She also distributed the events planned for 2017 by the events committee, noting a free community cookout on August 19th. Brenda Dorst reported 50 renewals and 3 new memberships for 2017, as well as several cards sent.

Maintenance committee report was distributed by Gail Jordan and placed on file. Major items included: Relocation of computer room to office area, and lockable cash box installed on side of pop cooler.

Announcements: Dr. Kristina Kennedy was to speak about chiropractic at seniors meeting the following evening. Walter Jones is speaking about ICBMs during the 1960" at the March 21st history meeting.

<u>Old Business:</u> Both the budget and the financial review committees were holding off until after the Valentines Dinner to have their first meetings.

<u>New Business:</u> Gini Coover reported on the Shade Community Market as held last year and made a proposal for the market this year. Following discussion, Fran Moxley moved to accept the proposal as written, subject to monthly reviews; motion carried with no negative votes.

Vacant custodial position was briefly discussed; Fran Moxley was to send a digital copy of the job description. Alex Couladis recommended closing the separate Ma and Pa Jerseyville account and transferring the funds to the main checking account; Heidi moved to do so; motion carried with no negative votes.

Jerry Foster brought up three ideas which had been submitted to the Executive Board for consideration. Status of library, status of exercise room, and creation of events room were discussed. Tammy Foster moved to schedule a day (Saturday, February 25th from 2-5 pm) for members to go through books to downsize library and also to look into getting a conference table for the room. Motion carried with no negative votes. Bev Guider moved to have the exercise room stay in its present location; motion carried with no negative votes. Bev Guider moved to convert the former computer room to an events room for consolidation, storage, and staging of decorations for events. Motion carried with no negative votes.

Gail Jordan noted that the Standing Rules, which were approved last December, stated that "every CNFP (Community Not For Profit) activity will have a sign-in sheet to allow accurate participation to be evaluated by the board". Also stated was that for any such activity "children under the age of 16 who are not accompanied by an adult must present a permission slip signed by their parents". Sign-in sheets and permission slips had been prepared and were placed for use at all such activities.

SCCA March 8, 2017 Meeting Minutes (APPROVED)

(19 present, 12 members+ 7 officers/board)

The regular monthly meeting of the Shade Community Center Association was held on Wednesday, March 8th at 7:04 pm in the Shade Community Center cafeteria, President Jerry Foster being in the chair and Recording Secretary Gail Jordan being present.

Minutes of the February 8th regular monthly meeting were distributed by Gail Jordan for reading. Tammy Foster moved for approval as written; minutes approved. Alex Couladis distributed the Treasurer's Report for February as well as year-to-date. Net income for February was \$254.09. Checking account balance was \$18,091.12. Reports were filed for financial review.

Brenda Dorst gave Corresponding Secretary's report, including 67 membership renewals and 10 new memberships. She had sent get well cards to Brenda Ruth, Norm Shaner, and Joyce Curtis, and a sympathy card to Sue Downey. She also sent thank you's to the Lodi Township Trustees for gravel, as well as several to the OU Archery Club, Alexander Leo Club, and others for helping with the Valentines Dinner.

Events: For the Valentines Dinner, Jerry Foster reported \$3312 income, 1881.21 expenses, and net income of \$1430.79 (less \$54 advertising). Tammy Foster reported net income of \$215 from the first fish fry. Also announced were two more fish fries on 3/17 and 3/31, spring bazaar on 4/8, and egg hunt on 4/9.

Maintenance committee report was distributed by Gail Jordan and placed on file. Major items included: Moving and setting up shelving in events room and library, and township bringing and grading gravel in parking lot and near recycling containers.

Brenda Ruth noted that Walter Jones was to speak about "Living and Working with Intercontinental Ballistic Missiles during the 1960s" at the March 21st history meeting.

<u>Old Business:</u> Heidi Marty reported that the budget committee had a meeting tentatively scheduled for the following week. Pat Davidson reported that the financial review committee had met once and was about half done with their review of 2016 records.

Karen Jones reported that several people had been helping with the library, most of the thinning of the collection was complete, and books and tapes that had been removed were to be available until March 12th for people to take if they want.

<u>New Business:</u> Gail Jordan presented quotation in the amount of \$528.99 for a Brother monolaser all-in-one copier, printer, scanner to replace the old Canon copier. Joe Church of Quality Sales and Service who prepared the quotation stated that replacement parts needed for the Canon copier would cost over \$700. Alex Couladis moved to purchase the Brother copier; motion carried with no negative votes.

George Benz recommended Kandy Campbell for the custodial position. Pat Davidson moved that, after an initial meeting with the maintenance committee, to hire Kandy as an independent contractor at the same rate as before, subject to a two-month probationary period. Motion carried with no negative votes.

Meeting adjourned at 7:55 pm.

Cook's Corner

Cut-Out Cookies

Submitted by Tammy Foster

3/4 cup butter, softened

- 1 cup sugar
- 2 eggs
- 1 teaspoon vanilla
- 2 3/4 cups all-purpose flour
- 1 teaspoon baking powder
- 1/2 teaspoon salt



In a large mixing bowl, cream butter and sugar until light and fluffy. Add eggs and vanilla; mix well. Combine the flour, baking powder and salt; gradually add to creamed mixture and mix well. Chill for 1 hour or until firm.

On a lightly floured surface, roll out dough to 1/4 inch thickness. Cut out with cookie cutters of your choice. Using a floured spatula, transfer cookies to greased baking sheets. Bake at 375 for 8-10 minutes or until lightly browned. Cool completely on wire racks. Ice when cool.

Icing recipe

- 1 cup confectioners' sugar
- 2 teaspoons of milk
- 2 teaspoons of light corn syrup
- 1/4 teaspoon almond extract

In a small bowl, stir together confectioners' sugar and milk until smooth. Beat in corn syrup and almond extract until icing is smooth and glossy. If icing is too thick, add more corn syrup.

Divide into separate bowls, and add food colorings to each to desired intensity. Dip cookies, or paint them with a brush. Icing dries hard and shiny.
