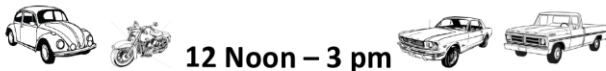

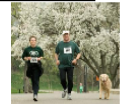

Chinese Auction Returns

SCCA April 12, 2017 Meeting Minutes (APPROVED 5-10-17)

(12 members+ 7 officers/board = 19 + 6 guests)

The regular monthly meeting of the Shade Community Center Association was held on Wednesday, April 12th at 7:06 pm in the Shade Community Center cafeteria, President Jerry Foster being in the chair and Recording Secretary Gail Jordan being present.

Greg Meeks and others representing the Lost in Lodi Enduro were present to answer questions. A phone number was shared for obtaining a copy of insurance for the event. Roberta Henderson moved to allow parking on the ballfield during the Enduro, if it is dry; motion carried with no negative votes.

Minutes of the March 8th regular monthly meeting were distributed by Gail Jordan for reading. Tammy Foster moved for approval as written; minutes approved. Alex Couladis distributed the Treasurer's Report for March as well as year-to-date. Net income for March was -\$1488.12. Checking account balance was \$16,250.10. Reports were filed for financial review.

Corresponding Secretary's report: 95 annual renewals and 13 new memberships so far this year; get well cards had been sent to Roger Howard and Nina Huffman. A thank you had been received from Julie Francis with the Stevens Literary Center of the OU Patton School of Education for books donated related to downsizing of the SCC library.

Maintenance committee report was distributed by Gail Jordan and placed on file. Major items included: Boilers were shut down for the season, and a radiant heater was installed above the steam table in the kitchen. Karen Jones noted that Dr. Rose Isgrigg would be presenting "Using DNA to Help Research Your Family Tree" at the April 18th history meeting. George Benz noted that the Seniors would be serving the Trustees Dinner on April 19th. The April calendar that Fran Moxley had prepared was distributed.

Events reports: Tammy Foster reported that net income for the two most recent fish fries on March 17th and March 31st was \$279.84 and \$333.91 respectively. The final fish fry this spring was planned for April 14th. Net income from the Spring Bazaar was \$437.08. Robin Krivesti reported 87 kids attended the Egg Hunt; Lost in Lodi donated \$50; \$96 was returned to the treasury. Jerry Foster reported progress for upcoming Chinese Auction on May 6th.

Old Business: Pat Davidson summarized the budget, which Fran Moxley had forwarded to her and which had been prepared by the budget committee, based on average income and expenses during the previous three years. Pat also reported that the Financial Review Committee had completed its work and planned to make a full report to the membership after discussion at the Executive Board meeting on April 26th. Karen Jones reported that the library organization was 99.9% finished and ready to use.

New Business: Jerry and Alex reported that the April 10th meeting with the Lodi Township Trustees went well. Tammy Foster and Brenda Ruth volunteered to attend the "Fundraising for Non-Profit Board Members" session being put on by the Athens Foundation on April 13th. Jerry Foster and Gail Jordan volunteered to attend the COAD workshop "Working with Your Board = Success for Your Nonprofit" on April 18th.

Announcements: Fred Colburn's 100th birthday open house and potluck is April 22nd at the Center. The Lodi Township annual clean-up day is April 22nd at the Township Hall.

Meeting adjourned at 8:11 pm.

SCCA May 10, 2017 Meeting Minutes (APPROVED 6-14-17)

(14 members+ 7 officers/board = 21)

The regular monthly meeting of the Shade Community Center Association was held on Wednesday, May 10th at 7:02 pm in the Shade Community Center cafeteria, President Jerry Foster being in the chair and Recording Secretary Gail Jordan being present.

Minutes of the April 12th regular monthly meeting and the April 26th Executive Board meeting were distributed by Gail Jordan for reading. Walter Jones moved for approval of the regular meeting minutes as corrected; minutes approved. Alex Couladis distributed the Treasurer's Report for April as well as year-to-date. Net income for April was -\$2,769.41. Checking account balance was \$13,480.69. Reports were filed for financial review.

Corresponding Secretary's report: Brenda Dorst reported 99 annual renewals and 15 new memberships so far this year. She had attempted to call some members who had not renewed for 2017 and had mailed 39 additional reminders. A get well card had been sent to Trudy Montle.

Maintenance committee report was distributed by Gail Jordan and placed on file. Major items included: Security signs had been put up, and upright commercial freezer was installed. Gail noted that shadecommunitycenter.org domain name had been registered again at GoDaddy.com, and he planned to link this to the SCCA wix website.

History group has no meeting planned for May, but the history room was to be open during the alumni banquet. Seniors had a social event planned for May 18th at Texas Roadhouse.

Fran Moxley summarized the calendars for May and June. Events committee reported moving yard sale to same day as Cruise-In in July, with specific date yet to be determined. June Stoddard volunteered to collect monies for space and tables at the yard sale; Tim Bails was to meet with Events Committee to help establish date for Cruise-In. Income from the Chinese Auction was \$3963.65 (\$4205.75 less \$242.10 expenses).

Old Business: Tammy Foster briefly reported on the Athens Foundation fundraising meeting that she and Brenda Ruth attended. Jerry and Gail also briefly reported on the COAD workshop about working with boards. Walter Jones noted that he was awaiting documentation from Tim Hastings of the Richland Fire Department confirming that the fire inspections were satisfied.

New Business: Pat Davidson presented the recommendation of the Executive Board that a cap of \$1500 be placed on the "Halloween" savings account (which also is used for the annual Egg Hunt and Breakfast with Santa). Bev Guider moved that this account be called the "Children's Events Fund" and that a \$1500 cap be

Alex Couladis move to authorize the maintenance committee to purchase and install additional security signs and dummy cameras. Motion carried with no negative votes. Bev Guider moved to authorize the maintenance committee to spend up to \$500 to secure the mail office by installing gratings over the glass of the window and door and by installing an electronically coded latch, with combinations only to officers and board members. Motion carried with no negative votes.

Jerry Foster introduced an idea to develop a proposal for an Athens Foundation grant this fall to install fencing around the playground, with the addition of benches and a picnic table inside the area; an estimate will be prepared. Pat Davidson described a program of the Athens County Commissioners "to encourage improvement in county communities", which included \$500 per project plus help finding resources. Alex Couladis suggested that Pat pursue this, and Fran Moxley suggested an article about it for inclusion in the next newsletter.

SCCA Executive Board Meeting Minutes – April 26, 2017

President Jerry Foster called meeting of the Executive Board to order at 6:00 pm. George Benz, Brenda Dorst, Gail Jordan, Norm Shaner, Pat Davidson, and Bev Guider also attended.

It was noted that election day was the following Tuesday and it might be necessary to store the equipment temporarily in the Seniors' room, since delivery was planned for Sunday and the gym was rented that day.

The report of the financial review committee was briefly discussed. The Board recommends, and will bring before the membership at the next regular monthly meeting, transfer of funds from the Halloween account to the main checking account, then closing the Halloween account. The report prepared by the budget committee was also briefly discussed. For 2018 this needs to be done earlier in the year, with better estimates of the levy amounts and excluding past expenditures such as the capital improvements made using funds from the Coen bequest.

Several security issues were discussed and will be brought before the membership at the next regular monthly meeting: more security signs, dummy cameras, increasing access to the computer office area for use of the new copier, and improving security to the mail office by installing an electronic coded latch and placing metal grating over the windows.

Jerry presented an idea for a grant proposal to the Athens Foundation: installing fencing around the playground (which originally was part of that project), transplanting the crimson maple tree, and placing benches and an octagon picnic table inside the enclosure. Pat note that deadlines for Athens Foundation grants are March and September.

Pat had talked to Athens County Commissioner Chris Chmiel about a grant program that the commissioners are implementing. She showed an A-News article about the program and an application form. Basically, the commissioners will provide some funds for a project and will help find additional funding resources. Pat will describe the requirements set by the commissioners and possible proposed community projects at the next regular monthly meeting.

Jerry had learned about the availability of a large commercial grade upright freezer for \$600 from a company going out of business. The consensus of the Board was to acquire this if it was still available.

Board began discussion of concerns regarding long-term use of the King building.
