Major Renovations Underway

The Coen bequest is funding more major renovations at the Shade Community Center. Our goal is to completely renovate both restrooms prior to the Alumni Banquet in early May.

The women's restroom is mostly complete after less than two weeks work. Jerry Foster, Ralph Calvert, Gail Jordan, Norm Shaner, and George Benz have gutted the room, snaked the drains,

rerouted the plumbing in and from the boiler room and to the new fixture locations, modified the electrical circuits to add lighting, laid new floor tile, installed new fixtures and stalls, and more.

The layout is much different, with larger stalls and sinks relocated. The lavatories have automatic faucets, and the toilets flush automatically. A baby changing table has been added in the former

storage closet, which long ago was the women's shower.

SCCA January 13, 2016 Meeting Summary

Officers for 2016 were installed: Pat Davidson, President; Fran Moxley, Vice President; Teresa Winning, Corresponding Secretary; Gail Jordan, Recording Secretary. Alex Couladis continues as Treasurer.

Roger Bail, Coordinator of the Athens-Hocking Solid Waste District, attended to describe the changes to single-stream recycling, where sorting of materials is no longer necessary. Recycling containers are to be placed at the Center with weekly pickups, and the monthly truck will be discontinued.

Treasurer's report indicated net income of -\$4,366.53 for December; -\$4,712.19 for 2015; checking account balance was \$19,323.30. Corresponding Secretaries reported sending 4 get well and 3 sympathy cards.

Vice President Fran Moxley distributed the events schedule for January and February. Fran moved to table the Events Committee report and discussion until the February meeting. Peggy Rist seconded; motion carried.

Gail Jordan reported maintenance of repairs to all gym door locks and replacement of pressure switch on No. 1 boiler by Twin Oaks. Brenda Ruth noted that monthly meeting of the history group on January 19 was to plan programs for the year. Manuel Grueser reported that the following evening the Shade Senior Citizens Association was swearing in its new officers for 2016: Jack Malloy, President; George Benz, Vice President; Julia Chadwell, Secretary; Manuel Grueser, Treasurer.

<u>Old Business:</u> Sean Bobo began providing janitorial services. Tammy Foster moved to contract Sean for snow removal up to \$35 per clearing. Fran seconded; motion carried.

Jerry Foster presented scenarios for totally updating both women's and men's restrooms. He estimated project cost at a maximum of \$17,500 for both restrooms if we provide the labor. Tammy Foster moved that the membership support going ahead with the project contingent on the approval of the full Coen bequest committee. Teresa Winning seconded; motion carried. Heidi Marty moved the SCCA pay for meals for workers. Tammy seconded; motion carried.

Heidi Marty suggested having a crafts/game night monthly, with one from 6-8 pm the Saturday after this meeting.

Gail Jordan reported that he and Fran Moxley had mostly completed the 2014 financial review. Teresa Winning volunteered to join Gail and Fran for review of the 2015 financial records.

The relocation of the library is on hold. Marvin and Heidi Marty are to get a price for professional cleaning of the carpet.

New Business: President Pat Davidson and Treasurer Alex Couladis are to present the financial report for 2015 to the Lodi Township Trustees at their April 11 meeting. Jerry Foster announced that the first meeting of the Valentines Dinner Committee was planned for Monday, January 18 at 6 pm.

Fran Moxley moved to table discussion of a Farmers' Market in Shade until Gini Coover is present. Heidi Marty seconded; motion carried.

Pat Davidson noted uncertainties of liability for the SCCA when the Lost in Lodi Enduro is held. Marvin Marty said that all participating riders and property owners have liability insurance.

Fran moved to adjourn; Marvin seconded; meeting adjourned at 9:12. 17 total attended (4 officers/board).

SCCA February 10, 2016 Meeting Summary

Vice President Fran Moxley called meeting to order at 7:03 p.m. Heidi Marty moved for approval of minutes as written, and Ray Baker seconded. Minutes approved.

Treasurer's Report: Net income for January was -\$1,473.86. Checking account balance \$17,616.02. Corresponding Secretary Teresa Winning reported 14 new members and that a get well card had been sent to Joe Davidson.

Vice President Fran Moxley distributed the events schedule for February, March, and part of April. Fran also presented recommendations of the events committee for 2016: Valentines Dinner, February 20; Spring Bazaar, March 19; Easter Egg Hunt, March 20; Fish Fry, April 15; Alumni Banquet, May 7; Yard Sale, June 4; "Burgers and Fries and Cherry Pies", July 9; Grandparent's Dinner, September 10; Jerseyville Festival October 15; Christmas Bazaar December 3.

Heidi Marty moved that Treasurer Alex Couladis fulfill Robin Krivesti's request for \$250 for the Easter Egg Hunt. Ray Baker seconded; motion carried.

Tammy Foster moved that Jerry Foster chair committee to prepare food for the alumni banquet and charge \$12 per meal. Heidi seconded; motion carried. Jerry announced that renovation of the women's restroom would begin on Monday, February 22nd. Brenda Ruth announced plan for February 16th history meeting included videos of old-time farming equipment. Seniors meeting scheduled for following night was canceled.

Old Business: Athens-Hocking Solid Waste District recycling containers are now in place beside the outside basketball courts . Gail Jordan reported income of \$490.75 for Alexander Youth Wrestling this year, even though only two home meets were held. Jerry Foster reported 210 reservations for the Valentines Dinner so far.

Fran sent invoice for first month of Sean Bobo's custodial services to Alex. Norm moved that Heidi arrange cleaning of carpet in second floor room proposed for relocated library at a cost of about \$100. Heidi seconded; motion carried.

Walter Jones announced that fire re-inspection is planned for end of March. He had contacted Jim Malone in Lancaster, who serviced the range hood suppression system when the building was a school. Jerry moved that Mr. Malone be brought in for an inspection. Teresa seconded; motion carried.

Jerry estimated cost to replace all 48 emergency lighting and exit signs, plus 20 smoke alarms, somewhat over \$2000. Teresa moved that these be purchased so they are on premises prior to the fire re-inspection. Norm seconded; motion carried.

New Business: Gail Jordan reported that RC Barnhart had helped troubleshoot problems with the Internet. Gail replaced a router to restore wireless Internet, and he also readied computer room for changeover to Windows 10. Heidi reported that 7 adults and 3 kids attended the first crafts/game night.

Gail Jordan will become newsletter editor beginning with the March-April newsletter. Tammy Foster announced that vendors are still being accepted and volunteers are needed for the Spring Bazaar. Plan is to offer breakfast and lunch that day. Marvin Marty inquired if SCCA would be interested in serving breakfast during Lost in Lodi Enduro on Sunday, April 10th.

Ray moved to adjourn; Marvin seconded; meeting adjourned at 8:31 p.m. 14 total attended (4 officers/board)



Cook's Corner

Cottage Colcannon (Irish Potatoes & Cabbage)

6-8 servings

1 ½ lb potatoes 1½ cup boiled cabbage

1 ½ cup milk 1 Tbsp butter (may prefer 4-6 Tbsp)

6 scallions 1 Tbsp chopped parsley

Cook and mash potatoes. Add butter and milk and beat until well creamed.

Then add finely chopped scallions or chives and cooked cabbage or kale.

Season to taste with salt, pepper, & nutmeg.

Colcannon is a traditional Irish dish mainly consisting of mashed potatoes with cabbage or kale. There are many regional variations of this dish. Usually the potatoes and cabbage or kale are mixed with milk or cream, butter, salt and pepper, although it can contain other ingredients such as spring onions, leeks, onions and chives.
