Kitchen Renovation

To everyone's pleased surprise, the heating and cooling system was replaced and functioning in time for the Jerseyville Festival. This included demolition and complete removal of the walk-in freezer; replacement of the unreliable, old gas furnace with a 95% efficient new one; installation of a central air conditioning system; new ductwork through the kitchen and cafeteria, plus into the storeroom; new tile on the floor where the walk-in freezer was; removal of the 2 window air conditioners and repair of the windows; repair of the roof leaks; and repair of the exhaust system over the gas range. In conjunction with the work done by the contractor, Twin Oaks Heating and Refrigeration (Coolville), we relocated the wall which had been between the walk-in freezer and the trash room, making the trash room smaller and enlarging the space where the walk-in had been. This provided space to move the chest freezer and two refrigerators from the front of the kitchen to the back wall, freeing workspace. An additional change to free up workspace was the removal of the custodial/mop sink. When all the construction was finished, Jerry finished the drywall and painted it. All this was accomplished in just one month, between the September meeting and the Jerseyville Festival. SCCA members who volunteered their time to make this happen included Jerry Foster, Gail Jordan, Walter Jones, Kenny Meeks, and Pat Davidson.

As most of you know, this project has been possible thanks to the generous bequest of Imogene Coen. Ms. Coen named three designates in her will—these are SCCA members whom she trusted to oversee the use of her bequest to improve the Center: Pauline Johnson, Nancy Hawk and Roberta Henderson. The Kitchen Project Committee, which consists of Robin Krivesti (representing Pauline Johnson), Fran Moxley (representing Nancy Hawk), Roberta Henderson, and Pat Davidson, has additional plans for improving the kitchen. These include repair of the ceiling where it was damaged by leaking water; repainting the kitchen and cafeteria walls; and possible installation of cabinets and a counter-top along the wall where the chest freezer used to sit. Stay tuned!

Additional Renovations

Submitted by Pat Davidson Thanks to Ms. Coen's bequest, additional renovations are planned. We will replace the two double front entry doors and the transoms above them, as well as the exterior doors at the front of the cafeteria and the rear of the kitchen. This will address three issues—leaking of cold air, unreliable locks and latches, and leaking of water under the front cafeteria door when it rains extra hard and blows from the west (as happened in August). Two contractors are preparing estimates for this project, and we expect to have the estimates for discussion at the November SCCA meeting.

An additional project is the updating of both restrooms. One contractor is preparing an estimate and we are searching for a second contractor to bid on the project.

We hope to complete the door replacement before winter sets in; the restroom project is slated for the winter months, and we hope it will be complete for the Valentine Dinner.

We also had help in unloading equipment with several players of the Copperhead's baseball team.

On many hot steaming evenings, Mark Kinder, Steve Dougan and John Robinson got the ball rolling. We hand dug post holes and they would fill up with ground water after a few minutes. Many members stopped by and pitched in. I know I will forget to mention someone - a thank you for giving your time.

I have sent several photos to Rhonda to place on the website as we progressed through building the playground.

A big thank you to the Lodi Township Trustees for providing heavy equipment to unload and to lift the rubber mulch bags that weighed a ton a piece. Trustee Denver Jordan and fellow employees helped spread the mulch to finish up the construction. We had the mulch spread in a couple hours.

One piece of the project did not get done was the fence around the playground. I will try to obtain funds to get this done in the upcoming year.

It was fun to see children using the playground after completion. I hope we can enjoy watching our children for many years on the playground. It is designed for ages 2-12 years.



Shade Community Center Monthly Meeting - Sept. 11, 2013

Attendance List misplaced. This is from memory and notes. Marvin Marty, Heidi Marty, Ray Baker, Roberta Henderson, Pat Davidson, Alex Couladis, Peggy Rist, Norman Shaner, Jerry Foster, Fran Moxley, Robin Krivesti, Peggy Grueser, Malcom Grueser, Rhonda Meeks, McKenzie Gilkey

Meeting opened by President Pat Davidson leading the attendees in the Pledge of Allegiance.

Secretary's Report -Minutes from July/August meeting approved as written. Motion - Marvin, Second - Ray.

Secretary Debbie McAdoo on her way to NV to be with her daughter. Fran Moxley will take notes.

Treasurer's Report - Check book balance is \$169,053.96 on Aug 30. Not a lot of activity in the past couple of months to report.

Corresponding Secretary's Report – Roberta will get a ham for the Haning Memorial Motion – Ray, Second – Roberta. Fran spoke with Jerry Haning about dinner.

Senior Report – Retired Teachers luncheon made \$280. There was food left in trash from previous events attracted gnats.

Miss Jerseyville gave a talk about what she did this past year going around to other festivals.

Peggy Grueser informed members Manuel is in Holzer Hospital at Gallipolis, very ill.

There was interjected into the agenda a discussion at this time with Heidi regarding painting by home school. Pat will forward email addresses so Heidi can coordinate with the schoolers. Heidi is to be given a key to the classroom/art room as well.

OLD BUSINESS - The rain today caused seepage into the boiler room and this began a discussion of the flooding in Aug. Drain and sump pump are not operational. Pat asked anytime we are in the building that we check all trash cans to make sure they are empty of food or other items that will attract bugs. Also that our former trash man Dave McCoy has retired and we have contracted with Paul Powell to pick up the trash for \$20 per month. Steve Kane reported work on the playground has been delayed by hay making, need mulch down and bags out of the way before Jerseyville. Report needs to be filled out for Sister's of St. Joseph.

Investment info remains the same as the last meeting. Jerry stated he is still unsure of the best course of actions. Alex suggested that we might not need to get in a great hurry. Currently there is more risk that the market will come down again, no reason to risk the money. Jerry suggested investing \$50K in CD, \$50 in brokerage account. Motion Fran moved, Peggy Rist Second. Motion passed. Alex will get info about the investment percent on a lower amount Robin requested that the exact wording of Emogene Coen's bequest be shared with the group. Available to all who wish a copy, too large to include here. Alex said he had a meeting with the attorney recently and another \$50K should be coming to the SCCA when the estate is finally settled. The representatives stated in the bequest were Nancy Hawk, Pauline Grim Johnson and Roberta Henderson. Due to personal reasons Nancy Hawk has requested that Fran Moxley serve as her representative, Pauline Johnson has appointed Robin Krivesti and Roberta is available to serve. The kitchen committee consists of Pat Davidson, representing the SCCA, Roberta Henderson, Fran Moxley and Robin Krivesti, representing Emogene Coen. It has been determined that the first priority will be to get a new heating/ac system for the cafeteria. Pat contacted 5 or 6 contractors and arranged a meeting time. Twin Oaks and A-1 were the only two who showed and submitted bids. Jerry suggested we could save on all bids by having someone remove the freezer who would want it for their own use. Also we could split the utility room where the trash and recycling is kept to give more space in the back of the kitchen. Both contractors' bids were studied and a vote was taken – Alex took physical count of vote. Twin Oaks – 9 A-1 – 5 Motion made to go with Twin Oaks option 2 – Roberta moved, Ray second. Show of hands – 13 in favor, 3 opposed. Motion carried.

NEW BUSINESS

Robin said she would need to have the normal \$800 to use for the Halloween Party, Alex moved, Fran second, the membership approved this amount by show of hands. Also she will need volunteers to get the center ready. Marlesia and Betsy to help as usual. Fran will send out an email to membership for help and baked goods.

The Royalty Committee will be holding a reception for the royalty and has invited royalty from other festivals to attend. They have prepared the old second grade room off of the fire escape for this and would like \$100 to use for this event. Motion made, Fran, Pat – second. Interviews for 2013 royalty will be on August 22.

Heidi has arranged for a program to be given by Tim Harrison, exotic animal catcher on October 5. On the same day at 12 noon there will be a presentation of nutrition for cows, horses and poultry. At 1:30 Tim will begin his presentation about the DWART (dangerous wild animal rescue team) group and this will include a talk and a video/slide show.

Jerry said everything is coming together for Jerseyville, but we still need more volunteers. Meigs County Antique Tractors will have a parade again this year. The Local Girls are going to be playing and there are cloggers out of Meigs County coming as well. Cow patty bingo will be held but the calf patty have been cancelled.

On that note, Alex moved we adjourn, Ray seconded.

- 1. Took 10 fire extinguishers to Pallini's for checking and retagging for another year. As usual took half at a time. All are back in place except the large wet chemical one for the kitchen. I took it in two weeks ago, but they sent it somewhere for hydrotesting and there is a backlog. I was told it would be back yesterday, but it is not -- if not here by Friday, they will loan us one to use during the festival.
 - 2. Jerry replaced sump pump in boiler room
 - 3. Pat Davidson, Walter Jones, and Kenny Meeks helped with removing slop sink in kitchen and moving trash room wall prior to installation of new kitchen/cafeteria furnace. Jerry installed drywall, painted and rewired circuits that had to be disconnected so ductwork could be installed. I blocked large opening in trash room where exhaust fan had been -- still two smaller openings to block before winter.
 - Updated boiler permits are posted.
 - 5. More than usual mowing to try to get ready for Jerseyville. Pat weeded and sprayed. Jerry (and ?) weed eating all around.
 - 6. Window replaced where cafeteria air conditioner had been.
 - Box on roof over walk-in cooler compressor, which was built last fall, finally got primed and painted.
 - 7. Doc of not be waren cooler compressor, which was built as fair, infairly got prime and painted.

 8. Other preparations for Jerseyville: I pruned maple trees out front. Jerry and Manuel mulched all around. I cleaned lime deposits off Grim field marker (been aiming to do that for over a year)

SCCA OCTOBER 9, 2013 Proposed Draft
