SCCA Meeting Highlights

May 11, 2011 Monthly SCCA Meeting

Utilities bills are now submitted to the Lodi Township Trustees for payment, following the levy passed last fall. Both boilers passed inspection in April.

Chinese Auction income was \$5069 with over 700 items donated. More than 70 kids attended the first Easter Egg Hunt and collected over a thousand stuffed eggs.

Reid Hart joined Debbie McAdoo and Manuel Grueser on the Financial Review Committee, replacing Rhonda Meeks.

Pat Davidson reported that she and Peggy had met with representatives of the Shade Seniors. They agreed to maintain their 12.5% share of utilities for another year. They also requested the SCCA pick up fifty percent of cost of veterans dinner in November. Gail Jordan moved that the SCCA do so provided invitations go out to Lodi Township veterans whether members or not; Steve Kane seconded; motion carried.

A spaghetti dinner was to be provided to riders and landowners the evening before the Lost in Lodi Enduro motorcycle race, with other arrangements to be made for breakfast and dinner the day of the race. (22 attended the meeting)

May 31, 2011 SCCA Executive Board Meeting

Main discussion centered on building security issues, including consideration of installing scissors gates at the top of stairs on the second floor. Issues relating to the quilting groups are being mediated. Red Cross requested conducting a blood drive at the Center on July 12 and also requested another on September 6. It was decided not to have an Appreciation Day/Open House this year. (Pat Davidson, Steve Kane, Rhonda Meeks, Peggy Rist and Fran Moxley attended.)

June 8, 2011 Monthly SCCA Meeting

Carol Little moved approval of revised SCCA By-laws and Standing Rules; Malcolm Grueser seconded; both were approved.

Steve Kane donated an alarm for the fire tower doors.

Pat Davidson reported approximately \$350 was made from the spaghetti dinner prior to the Lost in Lodi Enduro.

Next month proposed use of rooms by the quilting groups is to be discussed and considered for approval.

No one volunteered to chair the yard sale in July, in part because several members wanted to sell their own stuff at the sale. Fran Moxley volunteered to make the flyer, with Grace Dorst to distribute. Peggy Rist agreed to take calls for space and table reservations. (16 attended the meeting)

New Shade Area Tradition

No sooner was the inaugural running of the "Lost in Lodi" Sox Brookhart Memorial Enduro motorcycle race concluded than the race committee decided that the event will take place again next.

Local resident Greg Meeks initiated the idea for the event, inspired by his grandson. More than 130 riders took part, and \$5000 was raised to benefit the Richland Area Volunteer Fire Department, which has a station beside the Shade Community Center.

A rotating trophy, which will stay at the fire station, is named for longtime motorcycle racer and dealer Sox Brookhart. The race was named to honor Sox, and the trophy is made from an old wooden bike stand of his. Sox's widow, daughter and grand-daughter were on hand to present the trophy to overall winner Josh Gaitten.



According to Marvin Marty, the race covered over a hundred miles of roads and off-road trails in Lodi Township and northern Meigs County. More than 60 landowners agreed to use of their property, though only about twenty were used this year.

Ohio's Involvement in World War I

Cyrus Moore brought a unique perspective to World War I at the June history meeting. Cyrus has been a Civil War re-enactor for several years and became especially interested in World War I after being given his great grandfather Carl Snow's uniform.

World War I began like the wars of a hundred years before, with linear tactics as in the Civil War. It evolved into the first modern and large-scale war with the French introducing trench warfare and the Germans introducing poison gas as a weapon.

In 1917 Ohio held out for its own division, after having performed poorly when deployed to Mexico the year before and many wanted its National Guard combined with those of other states. The Ohio contingent became the 37th Division and was commended as one of the six best divisions during the war.

The Ohioans trained in Sheridan, Georgia and then were deployed to France, where they took the heights of Montfaucon alone, when the 79th Division could not get there. General Pershing selected the 37th to go to Belgium. Casualties were high: of 25,000 men in the division there were 3000 casualties, including 800 who were killed in action.

Ruth Family Connections

son Jacob was the father of Phillip, grandfather of Thomas, and greatgrandfather of John McClary Ruth.

John McClary Ruth was born in Baltimore, married Melissa Brill, and both died at Shade and are buried in Garden Cemetery. Brenda traced their descen-

Remembering Millfield

Eighty two people died on November 5, 1930 in the Millfield Mine Disaster, including relatives of member Deanna Poling. An electric spark in an unused part of the mine caused an explosion underground two miles from the entrance.

At the May history meeting, Ron Luce, Executive Director of the Athens Historical Society and Museum (pictured below with Deanna Poling) presented the events that led up to this



disaster and the results of the following investigation. In particular, he recognized three heroes who together saved over a hundred people the day of the disaster, namely Emerson LeFever, John Dean, and Robert Marshall. Emerson

was a relative of Deanna Poling's who made many trips into the mine to lead people out before dying from breathing poison gas. The deaths of 74 of the 82 were attributed to this "afterdamp" gas; only eight died from the force of the explosion or burns.

Ron is trying to get recognition for all who died in this disaster, not just the company executives who died as they were touring the mine at the time of the explosion.

Cook's Corner - Apple Butter Cake

1-1/2 c. raisins
3-1/2 c. flour
1/2 c. water
1/2 tsp. cloves
1/2 c. butter
1/2 tsp. nutmeg
2 c. brown sugar, packed
1 tsp. cinnamon
3 eggs, beaten
1 c. nuts, chopped

2 tsp. baking soda dissolved in 1 Tbsp. warm water and 2 c. apple butter slightly warm

Combine raisins and water in a small saucepan. Bring to a boil and simmer 15 minutes, then drain and cool. Next cream together butter and brown sugar; and then add eggs, and the soda/water/apple butter mixture.

Next mix the flour and spices. Use 1/4 c. of this mixture to dust the nuts. Then combine the dusted nuts with the remainder of the flour and spices.

Add this to the batter and spoon into a greased and floured 10-inch tube pan. Bake at 325°F for 1-1/2 hours.

In observance of the sesquicentennial anniversary of the Civil War, this recipe is from the booklet "Northern Ladies' Civil War Recipes" by Patricia B. Mitchell.

It looks like a good use for the apple butter that is made at the Jerseyville Festival!
